## PROOF OF VACCINATION IS REQUIRED INSIDE THE CATHEDRAL AND BUILDINGS

In observance of the New York City guidelines and recommendations from the CDC, to enter the Cathedral all visitors 12 and older must:

- Show proof that they have received a COVID-19 vaccine at least 14 days prior to entry
- Show valid ID
- Wear a mask

Visitors under 12 years old must:

- Be accompanied by a vaccinated guardian.
- Wear masks while inside the Cathedral, Cathedral buildings and grounds.

Proof of vaccination may include:

- NYC COVID Safe app: [Android](#) | [iOS](#)
- [Excelsior Pass](#)
- [CDC Vaccination Card](#) (or photo of card)
- [NYC Vaccination Record](#)
- An official immunization record from outside New York City or the United States.

Valid ID includes your name accompanied by a photograph such as:

- Driver's license
- Government ID card
- IDNYC card
- Passport
- School ID card

Outside on the Cathedral Grounds

- Visitors, congregants, guests, clergy and staff are required to get a temperature check and health screening at the Security Booth.
- Visitors, congregants, guests, clergy and staff wear masks or cloth face coverings.

WHAT THE CATHEDRAL EXPECTS FROM VISITORS, CONGREGANTS AND GUESTS

- Proof of vaccination to enter the Cathedral and all buildings on the grounds
- Everyone ages 2+ must wear a mask or cloth face covering conforming to CDC [guidelines](#) at all times.
- Maintain physical distancing between yourself and others.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or use hand sanitizer.
- Stay home if you're feeling unwell or have been in contact with people who have tested positive for COVID-19.

WHAT VISITORS, CONGREGANTS AND GUESTS CAN EXPECT FROM THE CATHEDRAL

- Clergy and staff are fully vaccinated
- Clergy and staff wear masks or cloth face coverings at all times.
- Limits on the number of visitors in Cathedral buildings
- Increased cleaning protocols and hand sanitizing stations for staff and visitors.
