Jordan river is chilly and cold, It chills the body, but not the soul; There ain't but one train upon this track, It runs to heaven and right back.




A collection is taken. The People may place their offerings in the basket as it is passed or use the QR code.

And lead us not into temptation,


but deliver us from evil.

The Holy Communion is distributed under the forms of both Bread and Wine. In the interest of public health, the Cathedral does not practice intinction, that is, the dipping of the Bread into the Wine. It is the faith of the Church that Jesus gives himself in the Sacrament whether it is received in only one kind or both. Gluten-free Wafers are available; please make your need known to the minister.
