MUSICA SACRA PRESENTS *SCHÜTZ, BACH, BRAHMS, AND BRUCKNER* AT THE CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE DIVINE

Performance Opens The 2017-2018 Season of Great Music In A Great Space Concert Series ***

New York (October XX, 2017) – Musica Sacra, the longest continuously performing professional chorus in New York City, inaugurates the 2017–2018 season of *Great Music in a Great Space* at St. John the Divine with a performance of works by Schütz, Bach, Brahms, and Bruckner on <u>Wednesday, October 25 at 7:30 p.m, at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine,</u> <u>1047 Amsterdam Avenue (at 112th Street), Manhattan.</u> Prior to the performance, the Concert Chorus of the Newark Boys Chorus School will present a pre-concert recital at 7 p.m.

J.S. Bach's motets are signature works of Musica Sacra; this concert features two of his most exuberant works, *Fürchte dich nicht*, BWV 228, and *Der Geist hilft unser Schwachheit auf*, BWV 226. These works are quintessential Baroque motets, and joyful dances permeate the rich choral textures. Heinrich Schütz, one of Bach's predecessors, composed marvelous psalms for double choir, and these show the influence of the Dresden court on the works of Bach. Brahms' motet *Ich aber bin elend* is written in the Venetian Baroque style, echoing Schütz's own Venetian influences. Rounding out the program are two sumptuous motets by Anton Bruckner – musical jewels of the Romantic era.

The 2017-2018 season of Great Music in a Great Space continues with a broad spectrum of choral and instrumental music in the Cathedral's grand and inspiring Gothic interior. Adding to a full season of choral, organ, and holiday performances, Musica Sacra will return to the Cathedral in the spring with a concert contrasting Franco-Flemish ancient works with those of contemporary American composers.
