THE CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE DIVINE ANNOUNCES THE EIGHTH SEASON OF ITS *GREAT MUSIC IN A GREAT SPACE* CONCERT SERIES

An Exhilarating 2018–2019 Season of Performances at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine

New York (August XX, 2018) The Cathedral of St. John the Divine presents its eighth season of **Great Music in a Great Space** under the direction of Kent Tritle, Director of Cathedral Music and Organist. From the elegance of Gabriel Fauré's *Requiem* to the intimate performance of the world-music ensemble **Rose of the Compass**, this season features a broad spectrum of choral and instrumental music in the Cathedral's grand and inspiring Gothic interior, **located at 1047 Amsterdam Avenue (at 112th Street)**.

The season kicks off with the return of Musica Sacra, featuring the music of Bach, Buxtehude, and Scarlatti on October 23rd. Rose of the Compass joins the Cathedral Choir on November 5th with a program celebrating the armistice that ended World War I and commemorating the Armenian genocide—itself a direct result of the war. Two French masters will be celebrated this season, showcasing Gabriel Fauré's gorgeously moving *Requiem*, as well as the mystical and deeply spiritual *Litanies à la Vierge noire* and *Quatre petites prières de Saint François d'Assise* by Francis Poulenc. In the spring, Musica Sacra will perform a world premiere by Pulitzer Prize finalist Michael Gilbertson, along with Byrd's *Mass for Five Voices*, along with works by Whitacre, Tavener, and Paulus.

Organ concerts feature Associate Director of Music Raymond Nagem and Artist in Residence David Briggs on the Cathedral's Great Organ.

Great Music in a Great Space is comprised of choral, organ and holiday concerts, including the annual Cathedral Christmas Concert and the beloved New Year's Eve Concert for Peace.

Kent Tritle is one of America's leading choral conductors. Called "the brightest star in New York's choral music world" by the *New York Times*, Tritle is in his sixth season as Director of Cathedral Music and organist at New York's Cathedral Church of Saint John the Divine. He is also Music Director of the Oratorio Society of New York and of Musica Sacra. He is Director of Choral Activities and Chair of the Organ Department at the Manhattan School of Music and on the graduate faculty of the Juilliard School. He is organist of the New York Philharmonic and the American Symphony Orchestra.

Tritle holds graduate and undergraduate degrees from the Juilliard School in organ performance and choral conducting. He has been featured on *ABC World News Tonight*, *National Public Radio*, and *Minnesota Public Radio*, as well as in the *New York Times* and the *Wall Street Journal*.
