

Memorial will include sermon by The Most Reverend Michael Curry, Presiding Bishop, The Episcopal Church

The Cathedral of St. John the Divine, joining with global activists, clergy, and revolutionary thinkers, will celebrate the life and legacy of The Most Reverend Archbishop Tutu in a memorial service on <u>Sunday, February 13 at 4 pm at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, 1047</u> <u>Amsterdam Avenue (at 112th Street).</u> The service will be livestreamed, with limited in-person attendance.

Archbishop Tutu, known throughout the world for preaching a Gospel of radical reconciliation and truth-telling, first spoke at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in 1986 to thank Americans for protesting against apartheid, and to raise awareness for South African refugee funds. After the Archbisop's passing in December 2021, the world mourned the loss of this great human rights activist and theologian, with politians and activists joining with outpourings of remembrance. In honor of Archbishop Tutu's legacy and memory, the Cathedral's memorial service will include a sermon by The Most Reverend Michael Curry, Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church. The Right Reverend Andrew Dietsche, Bishop of the Diocese of New York, and The Right Reverend Clifton Daniel, Dean of the Cathedral, will speak, along with fellow clergy and public figures.

Due to the ongoing pandemic and Cathedral construction work, in-person attendance for the memorial will be limited. The memorial will be livestreamed on the Cathedral's website, Facebook page, and YouTube channel for all to participate in this tribute to Archbishop Tutu's prophetic voice for justice.
