Concert begins the Cathedral's fall season of Great Music in a Great Space

The Cathedral of St. John the Divine's 2023-2024 season of Great Music in a Great Space concerts starts off with an extraordinary evening of a capella music with *SurRound*, a performance featuring choral ensemble Musica Sacra under the baton of Director of Cathedral Music Kent Tritle, on <u>Tuesday</u>, October 17 at 7:30 pm, at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, 1047 Amsterdam Avenue (at 112th Street).
