

The Candidates and Sponsors gather before the altar. The Celebrant says The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented. Genevieve Brock Deringer Lucy Sampaio Doherty Aiyan Saint Fernandez Alara Elaine Hatfield Tristen Earl Thompson The Candidates are presented by their Parents and Godparents as follows I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism. The Celebrant addresses the Parents and Godparents, saying Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life? Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help. The Celebrant then says Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ? Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the Parents and Godparents, who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.

Question	Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?	
Answer	I renounce them.	
Question	Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?



N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

When this action has been completed for all Candidates, the People stand, as able.

The Celebrant then prays over the Neophytes, and the People respond, "Amen."

The Holy Communion is distributed under the forms of both Bread and Wine. In the interest of public health, the Cathedral does not practice intinction, that is, the dipping of the Bread into the Wine. It is the faith of the Church that Jesus gives himself in the Sacrament whether it is received in only one kind or both. 
