Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents and Godparents*

I will, with God's help.

*The Celebrant then says*

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents and Godparents*

I will, with God's help.

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the Parents and Godparents, who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*People* I will, with God's help.


## PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

## THE BAPTISM

N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*Then the Celebrant places a hand on each Person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with Chrism and says*

N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

*People* Amen.

*When this action has been completed for all Candidates, the People stand, as able.*

*The Celebrant then prays over the Neophytes, and the People respond, "Amen."*

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.
