





LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO

(12:20-36)

Diacono Santo Evangelio de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo según San Juan.

Pueblo ¡Gloria a ti, Cristo Señor!

NTRE la gente que había ido a Jerusalén a adorar durante la fiesta, había algunos griegos. Éstos se acercaron a Felipe, que era de Betsaida, un pueblo de Galilea, y le rogaron: —Señor, queremos ver a Jesús.

Felipe fue y se lo dijo a Andrés, y los dos fueron a contárselo a Jesús. Jesús les dijo entonces: —Ha llegado la hora en que el Hijo del hombre va a ser glorificado. Les aseguro que si el grano de trigo al caer en tierra no muere, queda él solo; pero si muere, da abundante cosecha. El que ama su vida, la perderá; pero el que desprecia su vida en este mundo, la conservará para la vida eterna. A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL OF JOHN

(12:20-36)

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

OW among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die. The crowd answered him, 'We have heard from the law that the Messiah remains for ever. How can you say that the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?' Jesus said to them, 'The light is with you for a little longer. Walk while you have the light, so that the darkness may not overtake you. If you walk in the darkness, you do not know where you are going. While you have the light, believe in the light, so that you may become children of light.'

After Jesus had said this, he departed and hid from them.

SERMON

The Right Reverend Matthew F. Heyd XVII Bishop of New York

THE BIDDING

The Sermon having ended, All stand, as able. The Bishop says

Y Beloved Family in Christ, I bid you on this day to remember before our God the Clergy who have served our people through the challenge of changing times and the eternal imperatives of Christian justice which have lifted our church and called us to a higher, braver and more faithful life; Clergy who preached the gospel of godly love, forgiveness of sin, peace on earth, and the equality of peoples across the divisions which have in our time separated Christians from one another and from the larger culture about us; Christian ministers who behaved as such when the costs were high and the path narrow. For their integrity, and for the preservation of our Communion in this Province I bid you give thanks.

I bid you remember the Bishops and other Clergy who in these last two centuries have led our people in the paths of peace and the ways of stalwart gentleness, amidst the social, political, and economic changes which have marked the period, guiding but never obscuring the landmark. God has taken them into a larger world, and a more visible Church. May God grant them memory eternal.

You and I are committed to a common belief in Sacraments, Scripture, Order, and Creed, but if we are ready to witness to this belief, we can do so only so far as our Faithful, and the world at large, are able to observe our devotion one to another, and our daily renewal of the vows and promises of Baptism which bind all Christians into holy fellowship and by which all our lives and ministries are shaped and strengthened by the love of God for all people through our Savior Jesus Christ.

I therefore bid you remember that it is only when we love one another that we can say truly, and affirm our Covenant with boldness:







THE COMMUNION

The Holy Communion is distributed under the forms of both Bread and Wine. In the interest of public health, the Cathedral does not practice intinction, that is, the dipping of the Bread into the Wine. It is the faith of the Church that Jesus gives himself in the Sacrament whether it is received in only one kind or both. THE CONSECRATION OF THE CHRISM

The Bishop says

EAR Friends in Christ: In the beginning, the Spirit of God hovered over the creation; and, throughout history, God, by the gift of the Holy Spirit, has empowered his people to serve him. As a sign of that gift, the priests and kings of Israel were anointed with oil; and our Lord Jesus was himself anointed with the Holy Spirit at his Baptism as the Christ, God's own Messiah. At Baptism, Christians are likewise anointed by that same Spirit to empower them for God's service. Let us now set apart this oil to be the sign of that anointing.

Let us pray.

Silence is kept. The Bishop then places a hand on the vessel of oil and prays.

God our maker, source of all growth in holiness, accept the joyful thanks and praise we offer in the name of your Church. In the beginning, at your command, the earth produced fruitbearing trees.

From the fruit of the olive tree you have provided us with oil for holy chrism. The prophet David sang of the life and joy that the oil would bring us in the sacraments of your love. After the avenging flood, the dove returning to Noah with an olive branch announced your gift of peace. This was a sign of a greater gift to come. Now the waters of baptism wash away the sins of all and by anointing with olive oil you make us radiant with your joy.

Eternal Father, whose blessed Son was anointed by the Holy Spirit to be the Savior and servant of all, we pray you to consecrate this oil, that those who are sealed with it may share in the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever.
